It was fun because I got to see animals.-Noah.

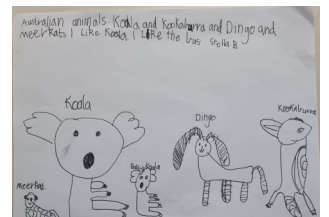
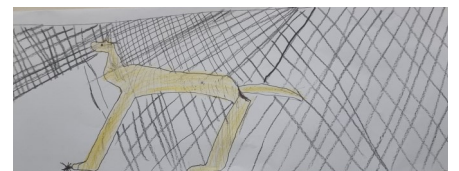
At Kyabram Fauna Park my favourite part was all of them. My first favourite was the Ring Tail Possum. -Abbey.

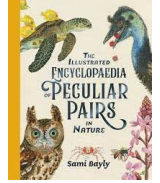
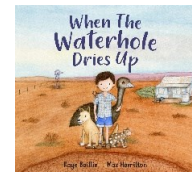
