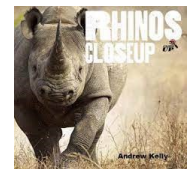
Picture story

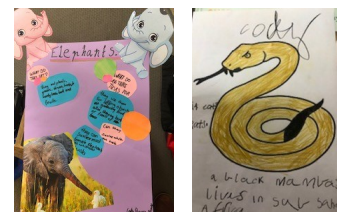
