This week in MARC Lessons the **older grades** have continued to focus on Australian Authors, with our focus being on **Sally Morgan**.

Sally Morgan is an Indigenous Author who has written several books, including The River, This Is Me, Little Bird's Day and Sisterheart. We have focused on **The River** and the illustrations of the Australian animals, including the turtle, crocodile and the kangaroo. We have discussed the colours of the art and tried to incorporate these colours into our own animal drawings. Lots of children can relate to the story as they too live close to a river.

The **younger classes** have focused on another Australian Author, **Alison Lester**. Alison Lester loves to write stories about horses and travelling. We have looked at her book **The Journey Home** where 2 children dig a hole to the North Pole, where their adventure begins. The children have chosen a character from the story to draw or colour and have voiced their reasoning for choosing that particular character. We have some budding Pirates in our midst!!

Borrowing is happening once again this Term and I encourage all children to borrow from the MARC van – there are some fantastic new books that I have purchased from the recent Book Fair. Please remember to return your books on *Friday and some Monday's*, when the MARC Van is in Kerang.
